



REVITALISING THE BRIDGEVVATER'S RICH HISTORY _____

Full steam ahead....

One of engineering genius James Nasmyth's steam hammers - nicknamed Thor after the Norse god of thunder because of the noise it made - stands opposite the site of his Victorian workshop in Patricroft. As part of our wider £5.5 million restoration package to the nearby Bridgewater Canal the historic machine has been restored, repainted, set within new landscaping and a new interpretive canopy will now protect it from the weather and explain its significance to visitors.

Nasmyth's Steam Hammer could gently break the top of an egg set in a wine glass without breaking the glass or be set to fall with such force it shook the whole building and could be heard for miles around. Thor was used at Elsecar Colliery in Barnsley for over 100 years before an enthusiastic group of local people brought it to Salford and it was set up at its current site, Nasmyth's Business Park which stands close to another masterpiece of engineering – the Bridgewater Canal.

Over 170 years later, you can now see one of his amazing pieces of machinery, restored to its former glory. If you'd like to get up close to have a look at Nasmyth's Steam Hammer, and find out more about it - we'll be visiting it as part of our walk - Industrial Ingenuity – iron, coal and canal on 21 May (more details on page 5).



Meanwhile at Worsley...

Further along the canal, the Worsley Green Monument was constructed in 1905 from the base of the chimney of Worsley Works Yard. Today, it's difficult to believe that Worsley Green was once a thriving industrial complex – home to a boat building yard, motor mill, timber yard, nail makers and a warehouse and workshops. In April, scaffolding and hoardings went up around the monument to allow us to repair and clean the brick and stone work so that by the end of June the monument will reveal itself anew. A striking reminder of the third Duke of Bridgewater who built Britain's first man-made waterway through the village between 1759 and 1761.



MINECRAFTING

This spring sees the launch of an ambitious recycling project that will bring the heritage of the Bridgewater Canal to life. In 1761, the Duke of Bridgewater had a major problem with flooding in his coal mines at Worsley. His solution was to create the world's first purpose built canal which also provided a new way of transporting the coal from the mines at Worsley Delph into Manchester. The boats that were used in the coal mines were of a unique design – often called starvationers because of the ribs that can be seen on the inside.

Worsley Delph will be transformed again in the next two years and eventually people will be able access this unique site on foot or by boat once again. As part of these improvement works, a small number of trees have had to be removed from the Delph and we are now looking to transform these trees into a boat.


We'll be working with Start Creative to support local men to create this amazing vessel. We will also offer accreditation to anyone interested in more than being involved just for fun.

EXPLORING THE WIDER BRIDGEWATER CANAL

The Bridgewater Canal developed from its roots in Salford to become a 65km (39 mile) waterway stretching from Runcorn to Leigh in the North West of England. It was originally constructed to transport the Duke of Bridgewater's coal from his mine at Worsley efficiently and cheaply to the rapidly expanding towns and cities nearby. At its peak, over 3 million tonnes of traffic used the Bridgewater Canal. Nowadays it is a leisure waterway popular with many cruising boaters. Walkers and cyclists can now explore many miles of the canal towpath which is being improved as part of the Bridgewater Way regeneration scheme which, when completed, will create a 39 mile leisure route along the whole length of the canal. Boaters

Boaters are welcome along the Bridgewater Canal route; all craft using the Bridgewater Canal must have a Bridgewater Canal Licence. Fishing



Duke's Drive Country Park is a new visitor hub for the Bridgewater Canal in Salford. There are over 50 new parking spaces conveniently located off Parrin Lane. The area is served by regular bus services (the nearest stop is Monton Green) including service numbers 33, 61, 62 and 68.
